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Recognizing Illegal Oxycodone Websites

Illegal websites use specific tactics to appear legitimate while operating outside all laws.

Absolute red flags for Oxycodone sellers:

Claims of "Rx-free" or "no prescription needed"

Promises of "overnight international direct fast delivery"

No prescription required at any point in checkout

- Prices dramatically lower than market rates (under \$10 per pill) Payment limited to cryptocurrency, wire transfer, or gift cards
- No physical address or pharmacy license displayed
- No pharmacist available for consultation
- Website created within the last year
- Shipping from international locations like China, India, Mexico, or Pakistan

What illegal sellers actually deliver:

1. Nothing at all after payment is processed
2. Fake tracking numbers with no actual shipment
3. Counterfeit pills containing fentanyl or other lethal substances
4. Expired medication that has degraded
5. Completely different drugs than what was ordered
6. Empty packages with legitimate looking external labels

Legitimate Oxycodone Access for Severe Pain

6. Physical address if any is listed on the site
7. Any communication you received from the vendor
8. Bank account, cryptocurrency wallet addresses, or credit card information used
