Snoring– It Could Be a Sign of Something **More Serious**



Snoring is more than just a nighttime annoyance - it can be a symptom of underlying ENT (Ear, Nose & Throat) issues that shouldn't be ignored. Whether it's disrupting your sleep or your partner's, persistent snoring can indicate more serious conditions such as Obstructive Sleep Apnea (OSA), nasal obstruction, or enlarged tonsils and adenoids.

Here's what you need to know:

Why Do People Snore?

Snoring occurs when airflow through the nose or throat is partially blocked, causing surrounding tissues to vibrate. This blockage may be due to:

- Deviated nasal septum
- Nasal polyps
- Enlarged tonsils or adenoids
- Chronic sinusitis
- Obesity or excess throat tissue

When Should You Be Concerned?

You should consult an ENT specialist if snoring is accompanied by:

DEPARTMENT OF ENT

- Daytime fatigue or sleepiness
- Pauses in breathing during sleep
- Gasping or choking at night
- Morning headaches
- Sore throat upon waking

These may be signs of sleep-disordered breathing, which can affect your heart health, blood pressure, and cognitive performance.

Our ENT experts perform a thorough assessment including nasal endoscopy, imaging, and sleep study referrals if needed. Based on the cause, treatment may involve:

- Lifestyle modifications
- Medical therapy for allergies or sinus issues
- Minimally invasive endoscopic procedures (e.g., functional endoscopic sinus surgery, septoplasty, turbinate reduction).
- Coblation assisted uvulopalatoplasty
- CPAP therapy coordination (in case of diagnosed sleep apnea)
